In all, there are more than 70 leading subjects in 10 sections ~ including a Members-only section for which you'll need a Password - which we'll convey in a Members-only setting.







And on the AWON website, you'll find out how we can help you honor your father in this way too!



AWON Moments

The mission of our AWON Moments series is to review AWON's history, celebrating special moments experienced by AWON's orphan members since Ann Bennett Mix founded the organization in 1991.

As we enter our 30th anniversary year, here are a few of AWON's milestones and AWON Moments that our members have experienced.

From *American WWII Orphans Network Newsletter*, Vol 25, Spring 2002 - Our AWON Conference 2002, November 1 – 4, 2002 will be in Branson Missouri at the LODGE OF THE OZARKS. The Veterans Memorial Museum center hall is the ONLY PLACE IN THE WORLD where a complete list of names of more than 400,000 men and women killed during WWII is displayed.

From Vol 26, May 2002, *Mid-Atlantic Air Museum Airshow* - AWON will be part of the 12th Annual World War II Weekend at the Reading, Pennsylvanian Airport from June 7-9. AWON will be hosting an exhibit and delivering one-hour daily briefings about our Fathers and AWON. This will be a weekend filled with the world of our Fathers...in the atmosphere of the home front and the battlefields of WWII.

From Vol 27, September 2002, Memory Books Update and Expansions – How all AWONers can get in on the Action - AWON has been helping to distribute two memory booklets, "My Father's Love" and "My Mother's Love", to children who lost a parent on September 11. So far, we have distributed 600 copies in Washington DC and New York. Now we want to expand our outreach to include any child across the country who loses a parent to illness, accident, war or terrorism.

From Vol 28, Winter 2002, AWON Quilt Honors Our Fathers - Our AWON Board Secretary Judi Kramer has created a beautiful patchwork quilt in honor of our Fathers. In shades of blue, yellow and white, the center square consists of our AWON logo. Every member is invited to participate in this way of honoring their Father. Each rectangle is 1 inch by 4 inches, providing space for his rank, name, branch of service and the date and location of his death.

Unforgettable AWON Moment – From My Father's Lips to My Heart – On a trip to Italy to retrace her Father's steps, Betty Palonen Volkan came home with a treasure, not wanting to let it out of her sight. When the local museum curator and guide recognized her Father's name, he started looking in wooden boxes. Finally, in a trunk he found canteens and one was inscribed PALONEN ITALY I. Betty said, "I felt like it was a gift my Father left for me and somehow, I was drawn to Livergnano to find it."

The Train Ride That Never Ends

The ability of any adult to place themselves in a time and place in their distant past is a mysterious and difficult-to-explain phenomenon. My personal childhood recollections, I'm pleased to say, are dotted with several situations that engender vivid recall each time they pop into my mind.

One of those distant memories is of a time during 1944 when my father, mother, brother and I were present together on a train ride from Altoona, Pennsylvania (near my hometown of Hollidaysburg) to New Jersey. My father, Francis E. (Hank) Burtnett was traveling to Ft. Dix Military Base where he would convene again with the Army 2nd Infantry, 9th Infantry Regiment for final training and mobilization before shipping off to the war in Europe.

Maybe it was the excitement of what was the first ever long-distance train ride for this four year old. Maybe it was the novelty of watching the Pennsylvania and New Jersey countryside visually flash by the train window as we headed eastward. Maybe it was the sense of family that the entire experience generated. Whatever the magnet, that train ride---now more than 75 years ago---is etched in my memory and returns often when I think of my father.


Sergeant Hank Burtnett was killed in action on February 20, 1945 when German fire was thrust into an American encampment near the town of Bronsfeld, Germany and ravaged the fallback position his unit had taken in an attempt to prepare for a future ground assault. Hank, along with several comrades, fell during that engagement with the enemy. He lies today with his comrades in arms in the hallowed ground of Henri-Chappelle American Cemetery in Liege, Belgium.

All of my memories of that long ago railroad ride have us traveling in one direction---toward Fort Dix, New Jersey. Memories of the train ride back to Pennsylvania do not exist. It is as if the inner me is waiting for the four of us to join once again for a reunion and happy ride home to Hollidaysburg together.

I want Hank to meet my wife Susan, his grandchildren Kevin and Kimberly and his great grandchildren Jack, Alexandra and Will. I don't want the train ride to ever end. I have often wondered why my parents elected to postpone their goodbyes to the very last minute. It was as if they knew Dad wasn't going to return and wanted all of us to be together as long as possible.

Seventy-five years is a long train ride and revisiting it every once in a while brings an instant smile to my face.

Free Entrance to National Parks for Gold Star Families

Former U. S. Secretary of the Interior David Bernhart announced a Secretarial Order on October 28, 2020, granting Gold Star Families free access to national parks, wildlife refuges and other sites managed by the Department of the Interior.

The access passes, called America The Beautiful passes, are normally \$80 per year, and this program will be continued indefinitely unless the Secreterial Order creating the program is amended, superseded, or revoked.

Beginning on Veterans Day, November 11, 2020, Gold Star Families and U.S. military veterans will receive free access to more than 2,000 federal recreation areas, including national parks, wildlife refuges and forests.

Accessible sites are spread out across more than 400 million acres of public lands, including Yosemite, Grand Canyon, Arches and Mount Rushmore National Memorial. The free access program is a way to thank America's veterans and Gold Star Families for their support of our country and to encourage them to explore recreational opportunities on their public lands and waters.

The waiver fee does not cover expended amenity or user fees for activities such as camping, transportation, special recreation permits or special tours. But it does cover all occupants of a single, private non-commercial vehicle OR the voucher-holder and three persons (16 and older) where per person fees are charged. The voucher is non-transferrable and void if altered.

As Gold Star children, AWON members can obtain a Gold Star pass by downloading the Gold Star Voucher from the Internet by clicking the 'W' below, and printing and filling out the Voucher. Or, you can use the voucher on the opposite page.

Know Before You Go

With this voucher, entrance fees for the National Park Service, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and standard amenity recreation fees for Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and Forest Service sites will be waived for Gold Star Families.

- Valid for qualified holder of the voucher and occupants of a single, private non-commericial vehicle OR holder of the voucher and three persons (16 and older) where per person fees are charged.
- Void if altered
- Non-Transferable
- Valid photo ID required
- Representations of the voucher are prohibited; must show physical voucher.
- The voucher does not cover expanded amenity fees, such as parking fees, camping, special recreation permits, tours, etc. May not cover organized groups or concession operated facilities or activities. Check with the site ahead of time to find out.

Federal law at 18 USC 1001 makes it a crime in any matter within the jurisdiction of any department or agency of the United States for any person knowingly and willfully to falsify, conceal, or cover up by any trick, scheme, or device a material fact; to make any materially false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation; or to make or use any false writing or document knowing that it contains a material false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or entry. Violations of 18 U.S.C. 1001 are punishable by fines of up to \$10,000, imprisonment of up to five years, or both.

The financial summary is being published to provide financial information for the membership. AWON is a 501(c) 3 organization, tax deductible.

An income source greatly appreciated is donations in addition to annual dues.

Please note the CNX 2021 items are financial items that are no longer pertinent to the AWON budget i.e. Listserv (WP.Org), GoDaddy and Hosting 2 (West Point.org). The Wreath Fund continues to be a restricted fund dedicated only to providing wreaths to the overseas cemeteries and is noted on the financial summary as Designated Purpose Income/Expenses. There are no wreath expenses posted on the 2020 budget because the ABMC has closed the cemeteries until further notice. Hopefully, they will open in 2021/22.

For the budget year 2020 membership dues income remained steady. In addition, 2020 total income increased dramatically compared 2018 and 2019 because of conference revenue which also had to be refunded due to the rescheduling of the national conference as the result of COVID-19.
